- **6. Portland Public Schools Spotlight** Recognizing Gildersleeve as a School of Distinction Ryan Walstrom reported that five years ago, due to smarter balanced scores, Gildersleeve was identified as a school in need of improvement. Since that indicator, staff has been working hard to reverse that identification. Mr. Walstrom presented a power point on the steps taken to achieve where they are today. Staff shared their contributions to how they achieved the distinction.
- 7. Student Representative Report Caitlin reported that fall sports have come to a close, girls and boys soccer have advanced, football is doing well, Dec 6th is the NHS induction, the Veteran's day program went well, food drive going on now and food collected will go to the food bank. Liam reported the student senate ball will be 12/2, a new club has started Model UN, and musical rehearsals are starting.

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8. Communications and Updates

A. Superintendent's Report – Dr. Britton reported that he attended the science of reading master class today. On Professional Development day, 11/6, K-3 worked on the pilot for Into Reading, which will be launched Jan 2024. Teacher of the Year ceremony will take place tomorrow night, Sam Tucker will be honored. Friday is the CABE Convention in Mystic. Enrollment report submitted. New Board member leadership conference is in December. This would be suited for any Board member who has been on the Board for less than two years. Submitted correspondence from the data specialist at the state for Board review. Shared the CT State BOE five year plan. Asked the Board to review Policy 1312 – Public Complaints regarding some parent objections to text. Shared the process with the Board of addressing complaints and the vetting process. Dr. Britton shared the second draft of the Ed Spec Plans with the Board. At the next Board meeting the group will schedule the Board retreat in December. Survey post card targeted to hit households the Monday after Thanksgiving.

- B. Assistant to the Superintendent for Business and Financial Affairs Stephanie Fragola Authorized spending report submitted. Open Choice, speech and language, and outplacements contribute to approximately a \$350,000 deficit as of right now. This is at the 73% reimbursement rate.

Dawn reported that the numbers are stable; 281 IEP's, 20 outplaced students, 67 students in specialized programs, 4 magnet students needing services, 504 plans have been steady, 57 EL students. 23% prevalence rate. Contracting with an agency for speech and language services. Long term substitute for Life Skills will stay with us until we find the right candidate. Transition program transportation sharing a driver with the senior center. Paraprofessional update.
